This is our second summer offering Great Kids Farm and Forest Camp. This year, we plan to host 120 summer campers divided among four one-week camp sessions. Summer camp gives us the opportunity to get to know

students over the week, while allowing them to explore the forest, farm, and stream in ways that a group just visiting for a field trip cannot. It's fun to watch the campers make natural discoveries (ground beetles! Slugs! Crayfish!), while watching the camp counselors bond with the younger students and practice their leadership skills.
